Gospel: Luke 7:11-17

Jesus went to a town called Nain, accompanied by his disciples and a great number of people. When he was near the gate of the town it happened that a dead man was being carried out for burial, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow. And a considerable number of the townspeople were with her. When the Lord saw her he felt sorry for her. 'Do not cry' he said. Then he went up and put his hand on the bier and the bearers stood still, and he said, 'Young man, I tell you to get up.' And the dead man sat up and began to talk, and Jesus gave him to his mother. Everyone was filled with awe and praised God saying, 'A great prophet has appeared among us; God has visited his people.' And this opinion of him spread throughout Judaea and all over the countryside.

All Saints Day– 1st November 2025

All Saints' Day is a [Holy Day of Obligation](#) celebrated by the liturgical Church on November 1. We turn to the saints, those known and unknown by the Church, as guides and models of holiness on this day.

Catholics are expected to attend Mass on All Saints' Day. In 2025, since it falls on a Saturday, the obligation to attend Mass is lifted. Catholics are still obligated to attend Mass on Sunday, as usual.

All Souls Day– 2nd November 2025

A day of prayer for the souls of the deceased, particularly those in purgatory who are awaiting heaven.

How to observe All Souls day

- Attend Mass to offer the highest form of prayer for the souls of the deceased.
- Pray for loved ones who have passed away. A common prayer is, "Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen".
- Visit the graves of deceased loved ones and offer prayers at their resting place.

Light a candle at a grave or in a church to symbolize hope.

At St Dominic's Church you can visit your loved ones any time you come to Church if they are in our Columbarium, by the grotto. If you have your family member cremated and have not yet secured a place for them, come and visit our office (check opening hours) or call 428-7677 or even send an email (stdominicbb@gmail.com) for further details.

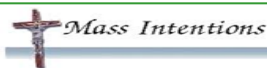
